COVERIS DONATION TO HELP RESTORATION PROJECT

Road One's Coveris has donated £4,000 to the Samaritans to help fund an urgent building and restoration project.

The charity's Mid Cheshire Centre in Northwich is in a bad state of repair and is facing a bill of around £37,000 to make the necessary improvements.

After hearing the news, the team at Coveris Winsford applied for a grant from the Coveris Community Fund (CCF) to help with the repairs.

The CCF is a UK-based trust initiative set up by the business to support charities and community initiatives, give staff greater involvement in deciding which good causes to support, and to encourage them to undertake volunteering.

As well as donating £4,000, Coveris Winsford employees will also be helping with the restoration of the centre.

Mike Richardson, Technical Director at

"I'm delighted and proud that the CCF is supporting our local Samaritans' appeal for funding to help pay for the refurbishment.

"This is a valued charity in our local community – they offer help and support to people who are struggling to cope 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

This meeting gave the board the opportunity to discuss crime, ASB, encampments and other relevant issues. There was a subsequent meeting with Inspector Murray and Chief Inspector Moss by the BID manager to follow up the issues discussed with the board. Further meetings are to be held with crime prevention officers and the local MP.

HS2

The proposed route of HS2 Phase 2b passes through the area of Wimboldsley to the east of Winsford, Davenham, Rudheath and Lostock Gralam. A depot will be constructed close to Wimboldsley to accommodate up to 54 high speed trains. The HS2 Supplementary Environmental Statement and Environmental Statement for the area between Wimboldsley and Lostock Gralam states that the current indicative construction programme is between 2027 and 2033.
